

INTERNATIONAL LITERACY DAY







ZONAL LEVEL SPORTS ACHIEVERS



World Tourism Day is commemorated each year on 27th September with celebrations led by UNWTO.


Its purpose is to bring awareness among the Global community of tourism social, cultural, political and economic value and their contribution. They can make in reaching the sustainable development goals.
