

FIELD TRIP - CLASS III to V

PLACE : METTUR DAM - SALEM

DATE : 01.10.2022

The importance of Educational trip includes giving to the students a chance for building closer bonds with their classmates and enjoy a day away from the classroom. Getting away from everyday atmosphere of the classroom gives students an opportunity to spend time with each other.

Our school arranged a field trip for the classes 3, 4 and 5 on Saturday, 1st October 2022. In this trip 176 children, 9 teachers participated. We prepared for the trip with 4 buses, sufficient water containers, first aid kit, snacks etc.

The students were taken to 1008 Sivalingam temple at Salem and Mettur Dam. The students boarded the bus at 7:00 a.m. and reached Sivan temple by 8:45 a.m. There all the children had their breakfast and visited the temple. They reached Mettur Dam at 2 p.m. and had a lot of fun playing in the park and seeing the architectural beauty of the dam.



FIELD TRIP - CLASS VI to VIII

PLACE : THANJAVUR AND KALLANAI

DATE : 03.10.2022

Objectives of the trip:-

The students will be able to

- Explore the places.
- Know about the history of the temple.
- Get direct exposure by seeing and touching the art and architectures.
- Develop skills like observation, identification, application of skill in real life situations.
- Develop cooperation, tolerance, sharing of knowledge, etc.



PLANNING THE TRIP:-

In the staff meeting comprising the Principal and all the other teachers, the following places were selected for our school education cum exposure visit.

- Thanjavur
- Kallanai

Then the following sequence of activities were

done as a preparation

1. Permission application letter was sent to the office of Zonal RTO.

2. A group discussion was conducted and the following points were discussed:

a. What is the purpose of the visit?

b. History of the temples – year of establishment, rulers who built the temples?

c. Connecting the concept of visit to the curriculum – (Historical importance of the temples, comparison between the construction style during the ancient and modern times)

d. Responsibilities were shared among the teachers (Bus arrangements, safety needs, food, refreshment)

• During the visit on 3rd October, 2022, we started our journey from Kongunadu Matric. Hr. Sec.

School, Nallipalayam at 5:30 a.m. with 160 students along with 9 teachers under the guidance of our school Principal Mr. M. Divyanathan.

• Students came with great enthusiasm. They had breakfast on the way to Thanjavur and reached Thanjavur at 10.30 a.m.

• The history of the temple was briefly explained by the teachers. The teachers also explained about the art, architecture and specialty of the temple. Then, the students were allowed to explore the site with complete freedom on seeing every part of the temple, our students were very happy and enjoyed well.

• The students boarded the bus at 12.30 p.m. and started our journey to Kallani.

• They had their lunch on the way and reached Kallanai at 2.30 p.m.

KALLANAI


◆ Kallanai is also known as the “Grand Anicut”. It is one of the oldest irrigation dams in the world built around 2000 years ago. It is the world's oldest dam which was built (in running water) across the Kaveri River in Trichy District in the state of Tamil Nadu in South India.

◆ The dam was originally constructed by the ‘Chola King Karikalan’ around the 2nd Century AD and is considered to be one of the oldest water-diversion or water-regulator structures in the world which is still in use.

HISTORY OF KALLANAI

◆ The Kallanai was originally built by Karikala Chola around the second century AD (2000 years ago). The main idea behind constructing the dam was to divert the river water to the delta districts thereby boosting irrigation. The dam was then re-modeled by the British during the 19th century.

◆ In 1804, Captain Caldwell, a military engineer was appointed to make a study on the Kaveri river and promote irrigation for the delta region. The main reason to build the dam was to divert floods from the Kaveri branch of the river into the Kollidam branch “via a short connecting stream”. He proposed a solution and raised the dam stones to a height of 0.69 m, thus increasing the capacity of the dam.



- ◆ The Lower Anaicut was built by Sir Arthur Cotton in 19th century AD across Coleroon, the major tributary of Cauvery, it is said to be a replicated structure of Kallanai till now.

CONSTRUCTION :

- The dam was constructed in an elegant way to see the dam from any point. The dam is about 329 m (1,079 ft) long, 20 m (66 ft) wide and 5.4 m (18ft) high. The Kaveri river splits into two at a point 20 miles (32 km) west of Kallanai. The two rivers form the island of Srirangam before joining at Kallanai.
- Our students had a careful catwalk over the Kallanai and enjoyed the breeze wind.
- The students boarded the bus at 5.00 p.m. and we have reached our school campus at 8.00 p.m.

CONCLUSION

On the whole, the education-cum-exposure visit was an amazing and excellent experience for the students. We also had very different experiences. During the visit, they learnt skills like co-operation, tolerance and sharing (children helped their friends who suffered from travel sickness; while moving from one place to another place they ensured each other's presence without expecting the teachers' assistance, and they shared their snacks with each other). The teachers were satisfied that the children had achieved the prime objective of the visit.

FIELD TRIP - CLASS IX to XII

PLACE : BANGALORE - MYSORE

DATE : 14.10.2022 to 16.10.2022

On October 13th the students started the journey to Bangalore and Mysore. Everyone was very much excited about the trip. It was an overnight journey, they reached Salem junction at 12 o'clock, boarded the train at 1:45 a.m. and reached Bangalore railway station at 8 a.m. Two vehicles were arranged for the boys and girls. They went to the hotel for refreshment. The restaurant facilities were good.



Day : 1 (14.10.2022)

BANNERGHATTA NATIONAL PARK

The students visited the Bannerghatta National Park. They saw several animals such as lions, tigers, bears, different types of deer, elephants, bisons and white tigers. They enjoyed the Bannerghatta National Park by watching the animals at a closer distance. It was really worth. Next, they went to VISHWESHWARAYA MUSEUM.

First, the students entered the dinosaur's room and saw a model of a dinosaur. It was roaring and moving its tail and neck. Then, they saw the model of a plane in the first floor similar to the one in which the Wright brothers made their first flight. That plane looked very light. The students played the piano in the air and it was amazing. There were two whispering disks, one student spoke at one disk and another student could hear it at other disk. It was really funny whispering and listening. Many satellites were displayed in the second floor.

Next, the students moved to ISKCON TEMPLE, BANGALORE. It was a memorable visit to the temple as this was really a great experience because of this massive architectural beauty, and its interior. It's not just a temple, but a different world with various religious, and spiritual activities. Central dome is extremely grand and beautifully designed.



Then, the students visited the Botanical Garden Lal Bagh. Glass House was modeled on London's Crystal Palace and is used as a venue for horticultural shows. The students visited the place. HMT has installed a Flower Clock in Lal Bagh with the clock dial measuring 7 meters in diameter. After visiting Lal Bagh, they had the dinner in the restaurant and stayed there.

Day : 2 (15.10.2022)

Then the trip continued with a visit to Srirangapatna. First, they saw Tipu Sultan's jail and took photos there. Place of Martyrdom or The Obelisk - is the spot where Tipu Sultan breathed his last in the legendary battle of Srirangapatna against the British in 1799. After visiting Srirangapatna, they returned to the hotel for lunch. Then they started the travel to see Brindavan Garden. They spent more time there with a lot of enjoyment. Brindavan Gardens is at the bottom of the Krishnaraja Sagara Dam (KRS), across the river Cauvery. The garden

entices visitors with its lush green lawns, terraces, flower beds, topiary and multihued fountains. The highlight for visitors is the famed musical fountain which is a water ballet of sorts, with lights and music and is played every evening for the tourists. After the visit, the students had dinner and stayed in Mysore.




NATIONAL POSTAL DAY (OCT 10)






