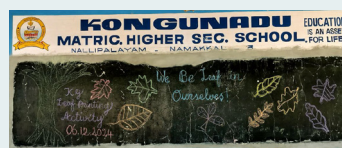
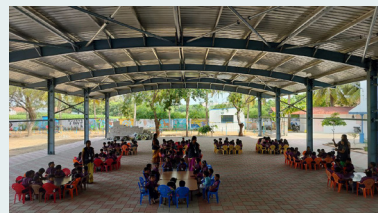
COLOUR CARNIVAL ACTIVITY

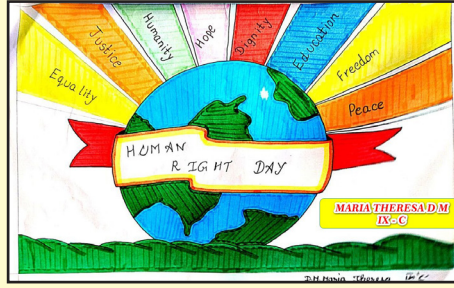

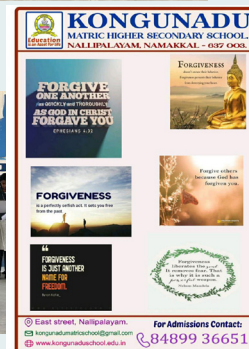
