## EDUCATIONAL TOUR

### Field Trip (I - III)

Our school arranged a field trip to Kurumbapatti Zoological Park on 26.09.2025. The students of embarked on the journey in the morning, filled with excitement. Around 190 students, 14 teachers, 5 attendants and 10 drivers took part in the field trip. The park was abundant in greenery and fresh air. They observed numerous animals and birds, like deer, peacocks, monkeys, snakes, and parrots. The teachers provided insights into their behaviors and the significance of wildlife conservation. They delighted in watching the animals and captured many photographs. It was a delightful and informative experience that imparted valuable knowledge about nature and wildlife.

### Field Trip (IV - VI)

The importance of an educational trip is highlighted by its capacity to enable students to build stronger connections with their classmates, discover new environments, and take a break from their regular classroom routine. By stepping outside the conventional classroom atmosphere, students can engage with each other in a novel setting.

Our school arranged a field trip for IV to VI std students on 30.09.2025. A total of 160 students, 11 teachers, 4 attendants, and 8 drivers took part in this excursion. The students visited the Big Temple in Tanjavur and the Kallanai Dam in Trichy. The students left the school at 7:30 a.m. During the ride to the temple, all the children completed their breakfast and arrived at the Big Temple by 11:30 a.m.

At the Big Temple, we viewed the Sivalinga, Datchanamoorthy, Thathathreyar, and other notable sites. Following our temple visit, we had lunch at Raja Raja Cholan Manimandabam at 1:00 p.m. Then departed for Kallanai Dam at 2:00 p.m. At Kallanai Dam, we appreciated the Karikala Cholan Manimandabam and enjoyed the sight of the flowing water in the dam.

We left the dam at 6:30 p.m. and returned to school by 9:00 p.m. During the journey, the students were distributed cakes and biscuits. The children had a wonderful time.

## **Field Field Trip to Vandalur Zoo**

Our school organized a field trip for students of 6<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> std. A total of 135 children, 9 teachers and 3 attendants, and 3 drivers participated in this trip. We were well-prepared with 3 buses, safety measures and water containers, a first aid kit, snacks, and more.

The students were taken to Vandalur Arignar Anna Zoological Park in Chennai. After refreshing we arrived at the zoo by 9:30 a.m. We observed various species of wild animals and birds, including lions, tigers, deer, giraffes, colorful parrots, peacocks, and crocodiles.

After visiting the zoo, we had lunch at the zoological park by 2:00 p.m. We departed for Mahabalipuram. and reached the shore temple by 6:00 p.m. The Tamil Dravida tradition is beautifully represented by rock-cut monuments like the Pancha Pandava Rathas. The students showed great interest in learning about the history of this temple.

We left Mahabalipuram at 10:30 p.m. and arrived back at school by 5:30 a.m. The students had a wonderful time.

## KG STUDENTS- SENSORY BINS ACTIVITY

KG students investigated textures using Sensory Bins filled with hard materials (stones, wood, metal) and 'soft materials' (cotton, feathers, sponge). Under supervision, they touched, felt, and described various objects (with eyes closed for heightened intensity), learning to identify textures as 'hard', 'soft', smooth, rough, or fluffy. Students related their experiences to real-life examples (e.g., "pillows are soft like sponge," "roads are hard like stones"). This activity enhanced sensory awareness, vocabulary, and descriptive thinking; students were actively engaged and eager for more. Future plans involve themed sensory bins (sand, water) and a Texture Show & Tell. The activity achieved its objectives, improving fine motor skills and curiosity – students now confidently use terms like 'hard' and 'soft'. It is advisable to continue such activities for comprehensive development.



## SCIENCE AND COMPUTER SCIENCE DEPARTMENT DAY

The Science and Computer Science Department day was celebrated on 25-10-2025. Students demonstrated science projects, thorough explanations. A quiz competition was held for the students, who were organized into four teams namely "Software", "Eddie", "Sherlock", and "Smart". Each team consisted of four students from grades VI to IX. The selection of students was based on a preliminary test conducted in the previous week. And the dictation words were conducted for I to V. 
## IMPORTANT DAYS TO REMEMBER




